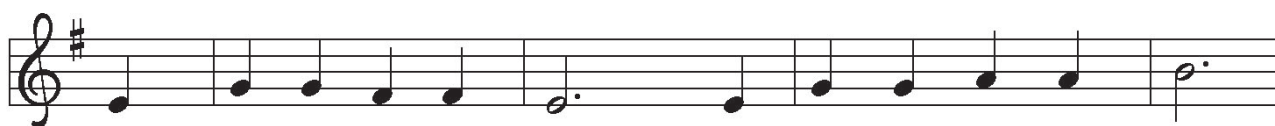

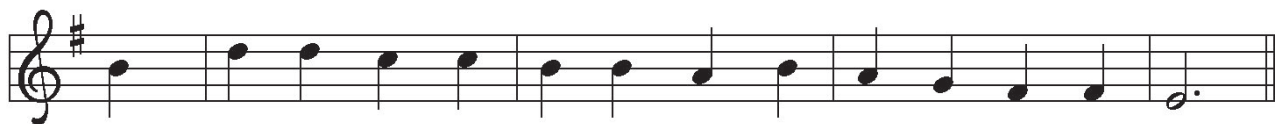

FIRST READING

Isaiah 56:1-8

God's saving activity extends beyond the bounds of Israel, reaching even to those the law excluded from temple worship. Even the foreigner and the eunuch who hold fast to the covenant will be gathered in, so that God's house shall be a house of prayer for all peoples.

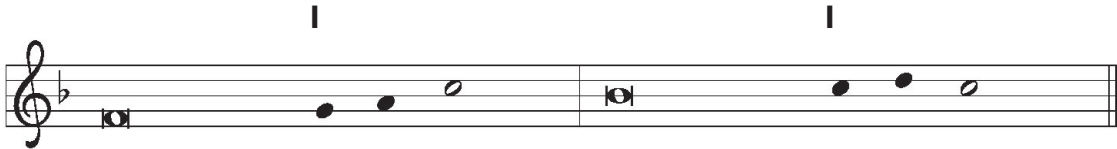

SECOND LESSON

Romans 11:1–6, 30–32

Paul wrestles with the fact that most of his people have rejected Jesus as messiah. In it he discerns a deep truth: God desires to be a God of mercy, not judgment. Even God's work of condemning disobedience is done for the sake of being merciful.

[Paul writes:] I ask, then, has God rejected his people? By no means! I myself am an Israelite, a descendant of Abraham, a member of the tribe of Benjamin. ² God has not rejected his people whom he foreknew. Do you not know what the scripture says of Elijah, how he pleads with God against Israel? ³ “Lord, they have killed your prophets, they have demolished your altars; I alone am left, and they are seeking my life.” ⁴ But what is the divine reply to him? “I have kept for myself seven thousand who have not bowed the knee to Baal.” ⁵ So, too, at the present time there is a remnant chosen by grace. ⁶ But if it is by grace, it is no longer on the basis of works, otherwise grace would no longer be grace.

³⁰ Just as you were once disobedient to God but have now received mercy because of their disobedience, ³¹ so also they have now been disobedient in order that, by the mercy shown to you, they also may now receive mercy. ³² For God has imprisoned all in disobedience so that he may be merciful to all.

Matthew 15:21-28

After entering a non-Israelite region, Jesus is approached by a foreign woman desperate for help for her daughter. When the disciples urge him to send her away, he initially seems to do as they ask. However, by the woman's faithful persistence, Jesus's "no" leads to an emphatic "yes."

²¹ Jesus left that place and went away to the district of Tyre and Sidon. ²² Just then a Canaanite woman from that region came out and started shouting, "Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David; my daughter is tormented by a demon." ²³ But he did not answer her at all. And his disciples came and urged him, saying, "Send her away, for she keeps shouting after us." ²⁴ He answered, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." ²⁵ But she came and knelt before him, saying, "Lord, help

me.”²⁶ He answered, “It is not fair to take the children’s food and throw it to the dogs.”²⁷ She said, “Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters’ table.”²⁸ Then Jesus answered her, “Woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish.” And her daughter was healed from that moment.

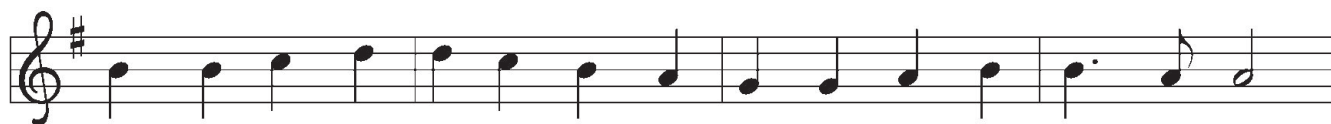
